The ongoing war in Ukraine, rising geopolitical tensions around the Black Sea, disrupted supply chains, the establishment of new trade routes, and the dynamics of transatlantic relations have transformed the Three Seas Initiative (3SI) from a visionary infrastructure project into a key pillar of regional stability.
