

#### THREE SEAS ONE OPPORTUNITY: WELCOME TO WARSAW

Warsaw | April 27, 2025

The Three Seas region faces challenges that are redefining its future. The ongoing war in Ukraine, rising geopolitical tensions around the Black Sea, disrupted supply chains, the establishment of new trade routes, and the dynamics of transatlantic relations have transformed the Three Seas Initiative (3SI) from a visionary infrastructure project into a key pillar of regional stability.

As the world undergoes a period of uncertainty, the Three Seas nations have a unique opportunity to strengthen their position through economic cooperation, investments in strategic infrastructure, and coordinated security efforts. As the host of the 2025 Three Seas Summit, Warsaw will be the focal point of crucial discussions about the region's future in April 2025.

In this context, the THREE SEAS ONE OPPORTUNITY: WELCOME TO WARSAW conference will serve as an expert prelude to the official discussions at the Three Seas Summit. Participants will engage in indepth discussions, exchange experiences, and develop concrete recommendations for both the Summit and future regional strategies.
